

READING


PRAYER

All: Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.

READING

PRAYER

Presider: Jesus, you know what it means to stand alone in front of those who reject and insult you.

In the next couple of days, we will renew our baptismal promises and recommit ourselves to living as your followers. May we recognize the burdens others carry and reject all perspectives and beliefs that are contrary

to the Gospel.

Walk with us when we feel that we are unable to make a difference. Help us to be kind. And teach us to share

your love.

PRAYER


Presider:

Presider: Loving God, Mary has always cared for Jesus' every need, and now, in Mary's arms, Jesus finds comfort along the walk to Calvary. Caring for Jesus in this dark moment reminds us of other difficult times for the Holy Family—like leaving their home to travel to Bethlehem and fleeing Herod's persecution by escaping to Egypt.


Just like the Holy Family, many in our world are refugees.

In 2023, over 114 million people were forced to flee their homes due to conflict, persecution, and human rights violations. That means that more than 1 out of every 74 people on Earth is forcibly displaced from his or her home.

We are a human family; let us find ways to welcome our displaced brothers and sisters into our country, schools, and parishes.

PRAYER


Presider:

Many 'Simons' must respond to meet the pressing human needs in shelters, soup kitchens, houses of hospitality, and places of sanctuary. Give us your help to overcome any reluctance to associate with those who struggle without basic human needs. And help us choose compassion over personal convenience, and self-sacrifice over selfishness. May our global family, made up of many different cultures and religions, grow closer as one family united in you.

PRAYER


Presider:

PRAYER


Presider: Loving God, let us never underestimate how you can work through our hands. Help us to commit

PRAYER


Presider: Jesus, you always invite and never impose. You always seek to speak to people, and not just about them.

PRAYER



All: Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.


READING

READING


PRAYER

PRAYER


Presider:

Presider: Jesus, make us instruments of your care. Give us your eyes to clearly see and respect the beauty and the


dignity of every human life. Be with us as we accompany those who have reached the end of their earthly

READING



CLOSING PRAYER
